**Heb.2:14, Col.2:14-15**

**Destroy** - render ineffective, nullify, cancel; destroy, abolish, do away with — Barclay Newman: NT Greek-English Dictionary;

(B) To render inactive, idle, useless, ineffective, trans. — Complete Word Study Dictionary, The; make void, do away with, put an end to — Complete Word Study Dictionary, The; To destroy, cause to cease, do away with, put an end to (1 Cor. 6:13; 13:11; 15:24; Gal. 3:17; Eph. 2:15; 2 Thess. 2:8; 2 Tim. 1:10). With Paul it always denotes a complete cessation, not a temporary or partial ceasing (1 Cor. 1:28; 6:13). — Complete Word Study Dictionary, The

(C) to cause to become nothing, to put an end to. — Louw & Nida: NT Greek-English Lexicon

(D) “to render idle, unemployed, inactive, inoperative”: την γην, to deprive of its strength, make barren (A.V. “cumber”), Luke 13:7; to cause a person or a thing to have no further efficiency; to deprive of force, influence, power (A.V. “bring to nought, make of none effect”): — Thayer's Greek-English Lexicon

**Use the death of Jesus in prayer against the enemy.**

(A) - call upon greater power: to call upon a greater power such as God or a spirit for help - quote something in support: to quote, rely on, or use something such as a law in support of an argument or case- ask for something: to ask or appeal for something.
